Clog Dancers

This term we are having a couple of visits from the Glaisdale Cloggers. On Monday they led a session with the Junior Class at Egton Village Hall. It was a mixture of traditional Dutch and English styles. We had a terrific afternoon learning a range of steps and the beat and also some interesting history of how clogging began when workers put steps to the beat of the looms in the factories back in the day. We also learnt that the wooden soles of the clog were cut from the trees in Arncliffe Woods! A huge thank you to the team for their time and enthusiasm, they will be back in a week or two to work with the infants too!

Oktoberfest Fun Run

We have been asked to share the following information with you:

We have fixed the date for the OCTOBERFEST Fun Run this year as SUNDAY, Oct. 11th. Races begin at 2.00 at Whitby School as usual (Airy Hill site). There are races for Years 5 & 6 , Boys and Girls separately, also Years 3 & 4 too and an Open Race, following the usual pattern. Every runner will receive a medal and the first 2 finishers in each race will get a shield. Entries cost £3 each (to cover the cost of medals) and all are welcome.

This is always a really fun event and last year we had a record number of runners and there were lots of smiling faces. Not only did the children enjoy the run and their medal but last year over £1000 was raised for a charity called the Rainbow Dreams Trust. This year we would like to give runners the opportunity to raise money in support of the charity, Operation Smile, which helps children with cleft palate problems. At a relatively small cost and thanks to a simple operation, children suffering from this problem can be completely cured. We would like to do our bit to support the efforts of this charity.

Healthy Eating Policy

Following our parent consultation and our Governors meeting this week our revised Healthy Eating Policy is now in place in line with the [statutory government requirements](#). You can find this in full [HERE](#):

What does this mean for you as a parent in brief?

Acceptable Breaktime Snacks -fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, cheese, unsalted crackers, rice cakes, breadsticks, plain or low sugar biscuits, plain water only to drink

Unacceptable - crisps, sweets, chocolate, cake, pastries, cereal bars, sugary drinks, energy drinks etc

Packed Lunches - a sandwich, wrap, pasta or rice food, a source of protein, cheese, tuna, chicken, egg, hummus etc, fresh fruit, fresh vegetables, yogurt, a healthy low/no sugar dessert, water only to drink

We are aware that many of you may already have stocked up on snack items and lunch items that are now not encouraged in schools and so we will phase this policy in over the next two weeks. The policy will be expected to be adhered to in line with government schools policy by Monday 5th October.

Celebrations and Events - The good news is that treats for birthdays, events and special occasions are exempt from the school food standards!

Bag2School Collection

We will be having a Bag2School collection on Thursday 8th October at Danby and Egton Schools. If you are planning on having a good clear out before Christmas, this is the perfect opportunity whilst also raising money for the Friends of Egton School. Bag2School is a **free eco-friendly fundraising scheme** that helps schools, businesses, community groups, local councils, and charities **raise funds through textile recycling** as well as spreading textile recycling awareness. Please can all bags be brought onto the school playground by 9.00am on the morning of 8th October. We do have spare Bag2School bags in school we can send home upon request, though bin bags are fine to use. Please can bags be tied at the top so that items inside do not get dirty or wet, thank you. Please do not bring items in suitcases, bags for life or boxes as these cannot be accepted for collection, thank you.

Wednesday Fun Club

Fun Club will commence next Wednesday 16th September after school and run until half term. This is a free club that is open to all children from Reception to Year 6 and there will be a variety of activities for the children to choose from. If you would like your child to stay, please complete

the form [here](#). Please note that the free fun club will finish at 4.30pm and any children needing to stay later will then join Sunshine Club. Sunshine Club is available until 5.30pm and your child's ParentPay account will be charged £6.00 for the session.

Dinners and Breakfast and After School Clubs - September price increase

As is inevitable, with the increased cost of foods, we are having to increase our meal and clubs prices this year. If you have any questions, please do get in touch.

- Dinners for Junior children - increase from £2.90 to £3.00 (Infant meals continue to be free of charge through a government scheme)
- Breakfast Club: from £3.00 to £3.50 a day
- After School Club: remains at £2.50 3.30pm - 4.30pm - to include a drink and snack

From £3.00 to £3.50 4.30pm - 5.30pm - to include a drink and light tea, therefore both hours would be £6.00

- Milk prices are also increasing from 15p to 20p/ day.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals at present so will not be charged for school dinners whilst the scheme is in place.

Meals, clubs, school trips etc will continue to be charged to your child's ParentPay account. These are usually updated on a Friday or Monday. All new parents will be issued with an activation letter that gives instructions on how to set up a ParentPay account for your child within the next week. If you have any problems or queries, please get in touch.

Free School Meals Expansion Programme

As previously communicated, from September 2026 the Department for Education is extending entitlement to free school meals to include all children from households in receipt of Universal Credit. Although eligibility will be granted to all Universal Credit recipients, it is important to note

Safeguarding Children Telephone Number

If you have a safeguarding concern about a child, please note that from the 1st April 2023, the main customer service line for the new North Yorkshire Council will be changing. The new number will be **0300 131 2 131** and will replace the old 01609 780780 number. This will mean that all contacts for referrals for children within North Yorkshire need to go through the 0300 131 2 131 number. **This includes any contacts out of hours for the Emergency Duty Team.**

The contact number for the professionals line will remain the same 01609 535070.

Mobile Phones, Smart Watches and Devices

Mobile phone and smart watch technology has advanced significantly over the last few years and continues to evolve. Many phones and smart watches now offer internet and e-mail access, alongside standard functions of messaging, tracking, camera, video and sound recording. We are also seeing an increase in Smartwatch 'look-alikes' which have games and activities on which are proving a distraction to learning and are time consuming for teaching staff to monitor.

Smartwatches and Smart-Watch lookalikes are therefore **not permitted** to be worn to school in line with the recent change in Government guidelines.

However, in line with our passion for helping children to tell the time, a standard analogue or digital wrist watch may be worn. If you are unsure whether your child's watch is appropriate, you are welcome to check in with a member of staff.

Smart Watches and devices that are brought to school for any reason will be kept safely until the end of the school day.

DfE Guidance on reducing the spread of illnesses this winter

The DfE have asked that the following link is shared with parents as new guidance has been issued:

Please see the NHS Guidance '[Is my child too ill for school?](#)' Pupils shouldn't miss school on a precautionary basis and can normally attend with a mild cough or cold, unless they have a fever or diarrhoea or vomiting.

Free School Meal Eligibility

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, before benefits are taken into account.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and currently receives universal free school meals, please check your entitlement. Being eligible will mean that the school receives additional funding for your child which will go towards their learning and any additional support they may need. Please contact the school office if you require any assistance.

Updated Guidance from the DfE regarding unauthorised leave of absence

Please be advised that there have been some legal changes to the guidance that schools must follow with regards to unauthorised leave of absences during term time. The penalty amounts have been increased and also the introduction of possible legal intervention. Please see below the information from the DfE.

For unauthorised Leave of absence taken within a three-year rolling period, Penalty Notices will be issued as follows:

- *The first Penalty Notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular child will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days, this will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.*
- *A second Penalty Notice issued to the same parent in respect of the same child will be charged a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.*

PLEASE NOTE:

- ***A third Penalty Notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of issue of the first Penalty Notice.***
- ***In a case where the national threshold is met for the third time (or subsequent times) alternative action will be taken. This will include considering prosecution but may include other tools such as one of the other Legal Interventions to address poor attendance.***

As always, any leave of absence other than illness, must be requested in advance by completing a form to the headteacher. These forms are available from the school office.
